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SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

As we close out the first quarter of this school year, I would like to offer a thank you to all who have made the start of this academic year successful, in spite of the major curricular shifts we are currently working through. Parents, staff, and most importantly, students, have continued to work hard toward the objectives placed in front of us. For this, I am genuinely grateful.

Regarding those objectives, I want to take a minute and address the New York State Reform Initiative, and its centerpiece, the Common Core Standards. There are multiple valid opinions on the manner and method with which these have been implemented by New York State. Additionally, there are multiple viewpoints on the rigor and content of the standards themselves.

Any time the State or the Federal Governments choose to "transform" education, as we have now seen twice in the past decade, schools are faced with highly complex issues and no simple solutions. This was true ten years ago when faced with No Child Left Behind, and is equally true with the advent of the Common Core. As education professionals, we have a responsibility to meet the educational objectives placed on us by the State, regardless of our personal opinions. However, we also have a responsibility to operate in the best educational interest of our children in a much broader sense. For example, the Common Core standards are highly demanding of time and energy in math and ELA for staff and students alike. These subjects are obviously important and we must always strive to

do a better job in both. However, we must also strive to achieve these objectives in a way that does not ignore the importance of a child's social and emotional development at a young age. This is a tremendous challenge in an era of diminishing resources and capacity, but it is something that we work very hard on and always try to bear in mind.

Like most parents, I try my best to pay attention to my children's school-work and try to keep connected to their educational experience. I am sure that I, like many of you, have noticed the differences in the academic challenges they are facing. Please be assured that we remain sensitive to this and will do all we can to remain partners in this process. One of the most important things we can do as parents is to stay connected with our kids' teachers. Our district has a very dedicated faculty and administration who will do their best to listen to and answer your questions on these changes.

In closing, I will offer that this is the first year of the common core for most grades/subjects. The manner in which the State chose to implement this agenda has forced all of us to learn, adapt and teach to these standards in a very compressed time-frame. We will continue to work as hard as we can to provide the best educational experience possible for our students, and to improve on this effort every day moving forward.

The College Board’s Advanced Placement Program offers students the opportunity to take challenging college-level courses while still in high school, and to receive college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. Almost 15 percent of the more than one million high school students in more than 14,000 secondary schools worldwide who took AP Exams performed at a sufficiently high level to merit the recognition of AP Scholar.

Meredith Friend qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP Examinations with scores of 3 or higher. Meredith is currently a freshman at Colgate University. Congratulations to Meredith for earning this prestigious honor.

Information for Homeless Students

THE MCKINNEY-VENTO ACT COVERS CHILDREN AND YOUTH WHO DON'T HAVE A FIXED, ADEQUATE AND REGULAR NIGHTTIME RESIDENCE, SUCH AS THOSE LIVING:

- in an emergency or transitional shelter
- with friends or relatives due to loss of housing or economic hardship (also known as doubled up)
- in a motel, hotel or campground
- in a car, bus or train station or other public place
- in an abandoned building or some other inadequate accommodations
- or, in temporary situations while awaiting foster care placement

THEY CAN CHOOSE FROM:

- the school they went to when permanently housed (known as the school of origin)
- the last school they went to (also known as the school of origin)
- the school located in the attendance area where they are temporarily living (known as the local school)

STUDENTS IN TEMPORARY HOUSING HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- immediately enroll in school and attend classes
- get free transportation to the school of origin even if it is in another district
- get free transportation to the local school if transportation is provided to other students
- get special education services immediately if the student has a current IEP (even if the IEP itself is not available or if it is from another district)
- participate in any school activity that is available to other students and get transportation to and from all before or after-school activities if it is provided to other students
- get free school meals without filling out an application

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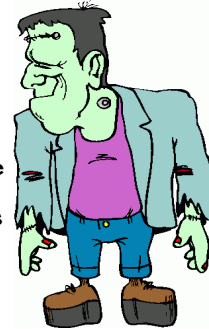
