

A message from our superintendent

Dear Parents, Guardians, and Community Members,

I am proud of the work we are doing here in Newark Valley. We are working on renewing our mission and vision, and a new strategic plan for the district. It is the foundation on which the administration and the Board of Education will make decisions on the direction of the district. These decisions will be fiscally responsible and maintain an educational program that will effectively meet the needs of all our students. The proposed 2024-2025 budget is \$29,803,569 with a 4.0% tax levy. This local tax levy increase is under the maximum tax cap; as our tax cap limit this year was 5.0%.

In light of the current economic climate, we have carefully reviewed our budget to identify areas where we can make strategic adjustments to ensure sustainability without compromising the educational experience of our students. Our goal is to maintain the existing programming that has proven


to be effective in meeting the diverse needs of our student body.


STUART WANDELL

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BUDGET:

Shall the Board of Education be authorized to expend the sum of \$29,803,569.00 for the 2024-2025 school year and to levy the necessary tax therefore?

PROPOSITION NO. 1

Shall the Board of Education of the Newark Valley Central School District, located in the counties of Tioga, Tompkins, Cortland and Broome, State of New York, be authorized to finance the costs of the acquisition of three (3) school buses at a maximum cost of \$504,554 and to authorize and issue serial bonds in the principal amount of \$454,099 and to levy real estate taxes for the cost of such purpose?

PROPOSITION NO. 2

If Proposition No. 1 is adopted, shall the Board of Education of the Newark Valley Central School District, located in the counties of Tioga, Tompkins, Cortland and Broome, State of New York, be authorized to expend \$50,455 from moneys in a voter approved capital reserve fund established by the School District on May 12, 1993, as amended on May 21, 2002, for the purchase of school buses and any other preliminary and incidental costs related thereto in and for the School District?
