Message from the Superintendent – Newark Valley Central School District

This winter has been a reminder of the kind of winters New York State used to have. With two months of potential winter weather still ahead, we have already used four of our six emergency days. I want to take this opportunity to clear up any misinformation, reinforce my commitment to the safety of our students and staff, and try to avoid any impact on spring break.

We will continue to utilize two-hour delays whenever possible to avoid using additional emergency days. However, the safety of our students and staff will always remain our top priority. If we use both remaining emergency days, May 23 will become a take-back day before any further adjustments are made. Should additional closures become necessary beyond that, we will implement remote instructional days.

While remote instruction is not ideal, it provides flexibility and helps us avoid cutting into scheduled vacations. Our goal is always to keep students in person whenever possible. If it looks like we may need to use remote days, we will communicate details to staff, students, and families in advance.

As we move through the second half of the school year, we take time to celebrate the many accomplishments of our students. Our senior student-athletes have been recognized for their dedication and hard work, and our talented musicians proudly represented our district at NYSSMA and All-County festivals. Our cheerleading and wrestling teams also brought home IAC championships, a testament to their commitment and perseverance.

At Nathan T. Hall Elementary,

our Festival of Learning provided students the opportunity to showcase their projects and presentations across a variety of subjects, demonstrating their curiosity and passion for learning. These authentic experiences are at the heart of our Blueprint for Excellence, ensuring that every student is empowered for success.

Looking ahead, please note that there will be no school on March 14 for Superintendent's Day. As winter winds down, we welcome the arrival of spring sports and warmer weather, bringing new opportunities for our students to grow and excel.

Exploring Leonardo Da Vinci: Newark Valley Students Embark on a Creative Journey

During November, fourth and fifth-grade students at Newark Valley Middle School explored the incredible legacy of Leonardo Da Vinci through hands-on projects inspired by his art, inventions, and ideas. This enriching experience was made possible by a grant from the education department at WSKG.

4th Grade: Studying Wind and Flight

Fourth-grade students delved into Da Vinci's fascination with wind, movement, and birds in flight. They learned how his observations led to designs that inspired modern innovations like helicopters and parachutes. As part of the project, students created their own wind catchers. These colorful creations allow them to observe wind patterns and reflect on Da Vinci's studies in a personal, tangible way.



5th Grade: Drawing Machines and Innovation

Fifth-grade students explored Da Vinci's extensive notebooks, which contain more than 20,000 pages of sketches, inventions, and machines. Many of these ideas were far ahead of their time, with some not realized until centuries after his death. Students partnered to design and build their own drawing machines using basic supplies and battery-operated motors. By modifying the motors, they created unique, moving devices capable of producing intricate lines, showcasing their ingenuity and echoing Da Vinci's innovative spirit.

NVHS Students Rise to the Challenge in Global Engineering Competition

Four teams from Newark Valley High School recently put their engineering skills to the test in the Science Buddies 2025 Engineering Challenge, a global competition where students tackle real-world engineering problems. This year's challenge, The Rocket Catcher Challenge, was inspired by cutting-edge advancements in reusable rocket and vertical landing technologies, similar to those pioneered by Blue Origin and SpaceX.

Using only paper, cardboard (base only), string, paperclips, and tape, students were tasked with designing and building a device capable of catching a falling rocket and ensuring a safe vertical landing. All four NVHS teams successfully engineered functional rocketcatching devices, demonstrating creativity, problem-solving, and teamwork. The teams will submit their results next week for review and will be entered into random drawings for cash prizes for their school.





of hard work and Cardinal pride. The Newark Valley community congratulates them and wishes them the best in their future endeavors.






Newark Valley Cheerleading Wins IAC Championship, Advances to Sectionals

Sgt. Justin Haines from the Cornell University Police Department brought his four-yearold German shorthaired pointer K-9 dog named

Luna. She joined the force in 2021 and is his partner as well as

family dog. She is trained in bombs, explosives, and article recovery. The K-9 units at Cornell sweep most large events on campus, including concerts, commencement, and visits from dignitaries. We learned that his police car is outfitted so that Luna has the



whole back seat to herself. There is a temperature monitoring system that keeps the car at just the right temperature for her. Luna demonstrated her capability to find an item.

Officer David Coakley from the SUNY Cortland Police Department introduced us to his seven-year-old German shorthaired pointer K-9 dog named Red. She is a high-

energy dog and is quite a bit larger than



Luna. Red has been trained in detecting explosives. She assists Officer Coakley on the SUNY Cortland campus as he patrols.

Newark Valley Student Wins First Place in Heavy Equipment Operations at SkillsUSA Competition


